The 2008 grant purchased medical equipment and the newly awarded 2010 grant will help complete clinic construction.



The clinic hosted three different nurses from the US and hosted one Medical team servicing 500 community members. There is another team planning to use the clinic in October.

In the interim the clinic does struggle to maintain wages, medication and morale in the crisis's affiliating the country.

The need for hygiene kits, food, clothing, quilts and shoes remain needed as supplies are depleted from the many seeking aid from the quake. Please consider giving toward the next container going in October or monetarily toward sending the container, for medication or wages.

I was privileged to visit Haiti for the sixth time June 2010 and am humbled at the wonderful things the Lord can do even amidst great crisis.

The Madeline Sewing Center and Sewing School

The sewing center has continued to operate since 2004. This year three students will have completed three years and graduate. The fashion show continues each July.

The women of the Madeline church will be also using the equipment to sew school uniforms from a small grant awarded by LMA. They continue to use the rooms for bible study and as a kitchen for church gatherings.

Needs for the sewing center are cupboards, a propane gas stove, locked storage units, thread, crotchet thread, yarn, church kitchenware, utensils, plates and silverware.
